The North East England Nature Partnership (NEENP) is a public, private, health, education and NGO partnership. We are responsible for promoting and developing **Environmental Growth** by championing investment in our natural capital. The environment is vital to many aspects of our lives and by leading on strategic, cross boundary and cross sector opportunities we can ensure that our economic and social ambitions also create places that are sustainable, resilient and rich in natural capital now and into the future.

Nature Partnerships were formed following the **Natural Environment White Paper** in 2011. This government initiative invited partners from all sectors to form strategic partnerships across the country resulting in 48 being approved.

Communicating the successes, challenges and opportunities of the environment sector is essential to the work of the partnership. By focusing on the **role of nature across the course of our lives** as well as its intrinsic value, we can engage a variety of sectors and interests in our work; developing networks and projects that provide multiple benefits for North East England.

**Environmental Growth** recognises the link between health, the economy and the environment. It involves investing in Nature, so that it is more connected, functions better and provides more for people and wildlife.

4. Driving regional delivery of Government initiatives and policy such as the **Clean Growth Strategy** and **25 Year Environment Plan** to ensure that they contribute to achieving Environmental Growth.
5. Advocating the **importance of biodiversity** and the danger of the continuation of current trends resulting in an overall decline.
